


Fig. 1 - Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 2 - Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Angular Displacement




Fig. 3 - Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage




Fig. 4 - Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Ambient Temperature




Fig. 5 - Relative Luminous Intensity vs. Forward Current






Fig. 6 - Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength
