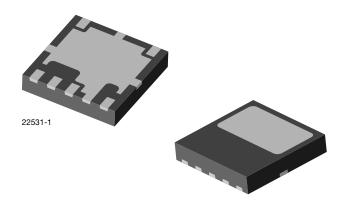

DESCRIPTION

The TSOP572.., TSOP574.. series are miniaturized receiver modules for infrared remote control systems. A PIN diode and a preamplifier are assembled on a lead frame, the epoxy lens cap is designed as an IR filter.

The demodulated output signal can be directly connected to a microprocessor. The TSOP572.. is a legacy product for all common IR remote control data formats. The TSOP574.. is optimized to suppress almost all spurious pulses from energy saving fluorescent lamps. They may suppress some data signals.

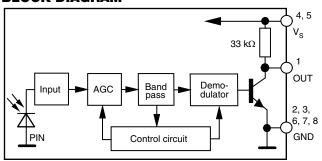

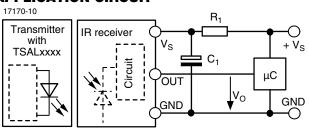

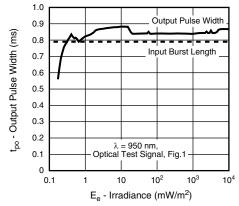
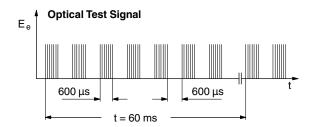


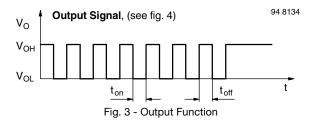
Fig. 2 - Pulse Length and Sensitivity in Dark Ambient



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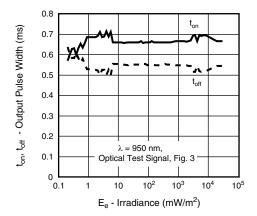


Fig. 4 - Output Pulse Diagram

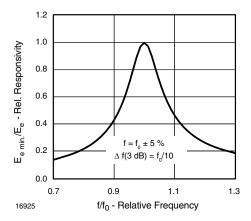


Fig. 5 - Frequency Dependance of Responsivity

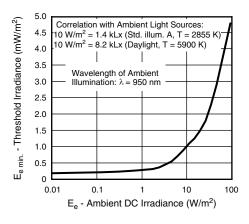


Fig. 6 - Sensitivity in Bright Ambient

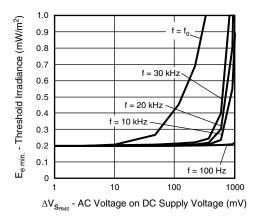


Fig. 7 - Sensitivity vs. Supply Voltage Disturbances

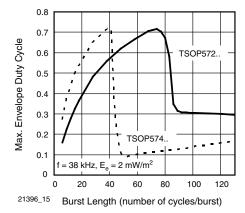


Fig. 8 - Max. Envelope Duty Cycle vs. Burst Length

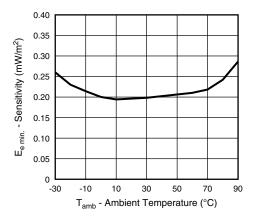


Fig. 9 - Sensitivity vs. Ambient Temperature

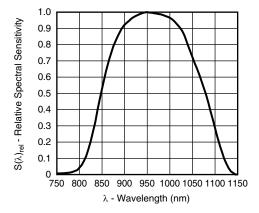


Fig. 10 - Relative Spectral Sensitivity vs. Wavelength

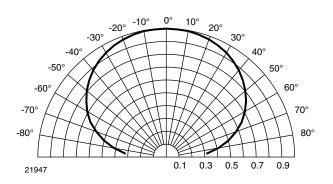


Fig. 11 - Horizontal Directivity

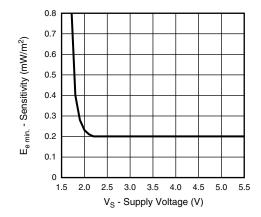


Fig. 12 - Sensitivity vs. Supply Voltage



SUITABLE DATA FORMAT

The TSOP572.., TSOP574.. series is designed to suppress spurious output pulses due to noise or disturbance signals. The devices can distinguish data signals from noise due to differences in frequency, burst length, and envelope duty cycle. The data signal should be close to the device's band-pass center frequency (e.g. 38 kHz) and fulfill the conditions in the table below.

When a data signal is applied to the TSOP572.., TSOP574.. in the presence of a disturbance, the sensitivity of the receiver is automatically reduced by the AGC to insure that no spurious pulses are present at the receiver's output. Some examples which are suppressed are:

- DC light (e.g. from tungsten bulbs sunlight)
- · Continuous signals at any frequency

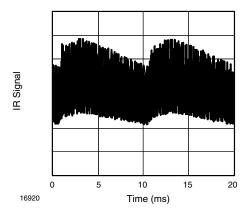


Fig. 13 - IR Signal from Fluorescent Lamp with Low Modulation

- Strongly or weakly modulated patterns from fluorescent lamps with electronic ballasts (see figure 12 or figure 13)

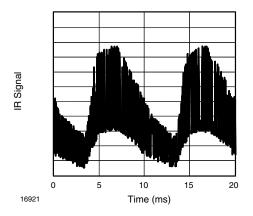


Fig. 14 - IR Signal from Fluorescent Lamp with High Modulation

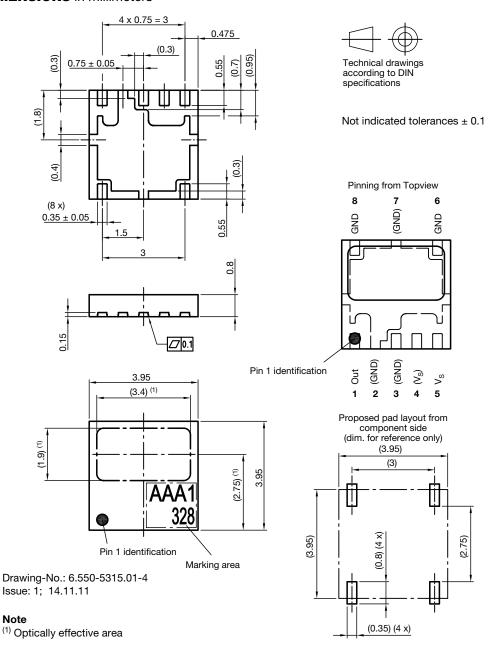

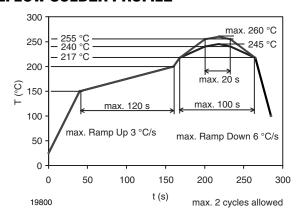
Reflow Soldering

- Reflow soldering must be done within 168 h while stored under a max. temperature of 30 °C, 60 % RH after opening the dry pack envelope
- Set the furnace temperatures for pre-heating and heating in accordance with the reflow temperature profile as shown in the diagram. Excercise extreme care to keep the maximum temperature below 260 °C. The temperature shown in the profile means the temperature at the device surface. Since there is a temperature difference between the component and the circuit board, it should be verified that the temperature of the device is accurately being measured
- Handling after reflow should be done only after the work surface has been cooled off

Manual Soldering

- Use a soldering iron of 25 W or less. Adjust the temperature of the soldering iron below 300 °C
- Finish soldering within 3 s
- Handle products only after the temperature has cooled off

VISHAY LEAD (Pb)-FREE REFLOW SOLDER PROFILE



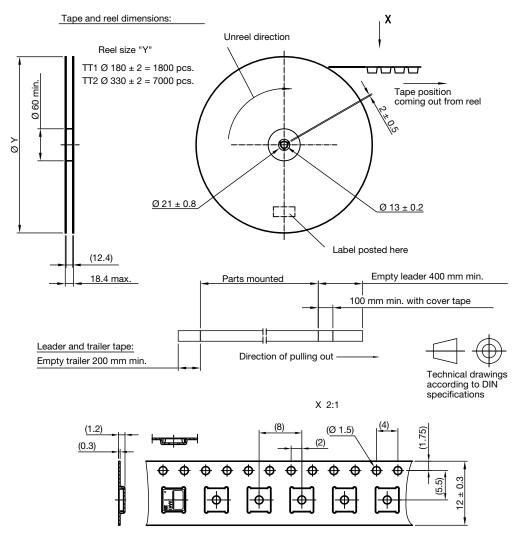

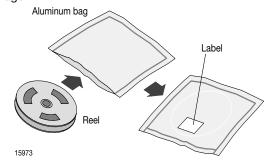
Standard bar code labels for finished goods

The standard bar code labels are product labels and used for identification of goods. The finished goods are packed in final packing area. The standard packing units are labeled with standard bar code labels before transported as finished goods to warehouses. The labels are on each packing unit and contain Vishay Semiconductor GmbH specific data.

DRY PACKING

The reel is packed in an anti-humidity bag to protect the devices from absorbing moisture during transportation and storage.



FINAL PACKING

The sealed reel is packed into a cardboard box. A secondary cardboard box is used for shipping purposes.

RECOMMENDED METHOD OF STORAGE

Dry box storage is recommended as soon as the aluminum bag has been opened to prevent moisture absorption. The following conditions should be observed, if dry boxes are not available:

- Storage temperature 10 °C to 30 °C
- Storage humidity ≤ 60 % RH max.

After more than 168 h under these conditions moisture content will be too high for reflow soldering.

In case of moisture absorption, the devices will recover to the former condition by drying under the following condition: 192 h at 40 $^{\circ}\text{C}$ + 5 $^{\circ}\text{C}$ / - 0 $^{\circ}\text{C}$ and < 5 % RH (dry air/nitrogen) or

96 h at 60 °C + 5 °C and < 5 % RH for all device containers or

24 h at 125 °C + 5 °C not suitable for reel or tubes.

An EIA JEDEC $^{\otimes}$ standard J-STD-020 level 3 label is included on all dry bags.
